

Music Courses

Group Tuition – Why learn in a group? Working together in a group has real value as the students see and hear individual progress of each other, providing group support and encouragement. The emphasis is on having fun while developing students' musical skills. It enables ensemble playing (duos, trios...) and in practical terms it keeps the cost down. Lessons will be weekly, for approximately **15 to 30 minutes**, and an appropriate tutor book may need to be purchased.



Keyboard

Students will learn on school Yamaha keyboards. Learn how to play different styles including folk, jazz, classical, rock.

Guitar

One of the most popular instruments to learn, the guitar can amuse the young student for hours on end emulating a favourite musician! A full range of guitar styles will be taught – folk, blues, classical and rock.

Tuesday or Thursday from 3.15pm to 6.30pm *Music Studio 1 or 6*



Bass Guitar

This instrument forms the basis of any band from Jazz to Rock. The student can be taught on a school instrument but they must have their own for practicing on at home.

Thursday from 3.15pm to 4.15pm *Music Studio 1*



Drum Kit

Playing a drum kit is a dream many students (and adults) have. The purchase of sticks is necessary. A drum kit is not needed to start with.

Tuesday or Thursday from 3.15pm to 6.15pm *Percussion Studio*



Saxophone or Clarinet

Learn these popular instruments and have fun with classical, jazz and rock music. Students will need their own instruments. Enquire at Cashmere High School music department for hire of an instrument.

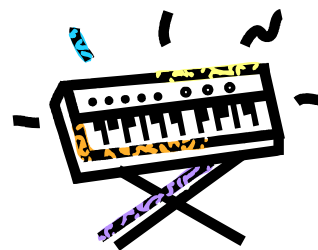

Performing Arts Programme for Children

This is an out of school hours programme for school students aged 7 and over

Courses Available:

Keyboard, Guitar, Bass Guitar, Drum Kit, Saxophone, Clarinet

Semesters

Each semester will run for 15 weeks:

Semester 1: Monday 13 Feb – 2 Apr & 23 Apr – 11 Jun
Tuesday 14 Feb – 3 Apr & 24 Apr – 5 Jun
Thursday 16 Feb – 5 Apr & 26 Apr – 7 Jun

Semester 2: Monday 30 Jul – 24 Sep & 15 Oct – 26 Nov
Tuesday 31 Jul – 25 Sep & 16 Oct – 20 Nov
Thursday 2 Aug – 27 Sep & 18 Oct – 22 Nov

No Classes: Queen's Birthday Monday 4 June

Tuition Fee: \$150 per semester *
(A semester is 2 terms with a total of 15 lessons)

Practice

Learning a musical instrument is rewarding, but practice is an essential part of the process. Tutors will specify a minimum that is necessary if good progress is to be made. A broad guide is 20 to 30 minutes minimum daily.

Parents/caregivers of younger students are always welcome to sit in on the lesson and discuss progress with the tutor and are encouraged to sit with them regularly while practising at home. A regular time each day is good practise.

Progress

Progress will be monitored regularly by tutors. A progress report will be sent home with the student at the end of each semester.
